The Tullett Prebon UK Economic and Fiscal Database 2012

As I explained here a few weeks ago, we have taken the opportunity to add new categories of information to the 2012 issue of The Tullett Prebon UK Economic & Fiscal Database, which is now available for free download on the Tullett Prebon [website](#). Additionally, we have a limited number of hard-copy versions, available on request. Please send your details to ukefdb@Tullettprebon.com.

Official data is often less accessible than many users of it would wish it to be, and this is especially true when seeking to use data from across more than one source. Our database is made available as a public service, designed to improve accessibility in this important regard and to contribute to the national debate about the economy, debt, spending and taxes by providing a source of readily-accessible statistics.

We ask only that attribution is given if database information is used in published form. The database is available to anyone for free download, and is written in Microsoft Excel format so that users can copy, link and paste it into their own spreadsheets.

I cannot stress too strongly that all future projections set out in the database are taken from official sources, and that the database contains no Tullett Prebon forecasts.

It will not surprise anyone that, in my opinion, official forecasts remain far too optimistic. No change there, then.
